#### 31st Anniversary of Indigenous Veterans Day

#### Remembrance Day

Tuesday, November 11<sup>th</sup>, 2025.
Remembrance Day was first observed in 1919, originally called "Armistice Day" to commemorate the agreement that ended the First World War on Monday, November 11<sup>th</sup>, 1918 at 11:00 AM - on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month.

Remembrance Day is a day that is to reflect those who sacrifised greatly in serving time in the World Wars. Each year on November 11<sup>th</sup>, at 11:00 AM Canadians pause for two minutes of silence to honor and remember the people who have served during times of war, conflict and peace. We remember more than 2,300,00 Canadians who have served through out Canada's history.

The red poppy is a symbol of remembrance as it flourished in the war-torn landscapes of the Western Front, where Dr. John McCrae sparked inspiration and wrote his poem, "In Flanders Fields.".

The Tachec, ferry terminal in Whaletown and Heriot Bay, Quadra Island will be shut down from February 9<sup>th</sup> to March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026.


A Water Taxi, with the capacity of 40 people will leave from the Mansons Landing Dock, 6 x a day with a shuttle available across Quadra Island. For those that want to leave a vehicle on Quadra Island, there will be parking available.

A Landing craft will be transporting essential service vehicles and dangerous cargo and can hold up to 16 regular vehicles and 12 passengers (There will be an application process to take a limited amount of other personal vehicles).


