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### **Project Information**

## Description and objectives of the project:

Included in the interior of the new Klahoose First Nation Cultural Center, will be a carved 360' totem pole, on permanent display. The totem pole will be highlighted in the center of the 6415 sqft building, underneath a skylight, and will be the centerpiece of Klahoose First Nation cultural display within the building.

Background information for the project (e.g. context, challenges, etc.):

- Log to be Selected from Klahoose First Nation Cultural Center Location at 1740
  Oceanview Rd prior to land clearing to be arranged via Devin Rogers.
- 2. Quick construction time, as this totem pole will be erected during construction of the new Klahoose First Nation Cultural Center, and cannot be erected into place once the roof is constructed.
- 3. The totem pole can either be carved in advance and erected complete, or can be stripped and ready for carving, erected into place into the building, and then carved vertically.

Description of Services: Log Selection & Carving/Painting of Klahoose First Nation Totem Pole
